Summary of Electronic Reporting Directives For Disclosure of Lobbying, Travel and Honoraria June 29, 2005

Status: Two separate directives on electronic reporting were issued by House Administration Committee Chairman Bob Ney to the Clerk of the House, Jeff Trandahl, on June 29, 2005.

1. Increases Lobbying Disclosure:

- Instructs the Clerk of the House to implement a mandatory electronic filing system for lobbying registration and financial disclosure reports filed by lobbyists.
- All lobbying registration, financial activity reports and amendments must be filed electronically after December 31, 2005.

2. Increases Travel and Honoraria Disclosure:

- Instructs the Clerk of the House to implement an electronic reporting system with full Web functionality for disclosure reports filed by members of Congress regarding privately-sponsored travel, official foreign travel, and donations to charities in lieu of honoraria.
- To be implemented by December 31, 2005.
